

Double Teeny Beanies

Basic Roll Brim Beanies, Two-at-a-time using Magic Loop

In order to make the decreases work without shifting stitches, these instructions are limited to three cast-on numbers.

You will need:

Suitable DK yarn (cotton or acrylic) - a 50g ball knits approx 4

Circular Knitting needle: metric size 4mm/US 6 with at least a 32" cable
sewing needle (with a big eye) to gather

Finished size approx 8 - 13.5" circumference

Knitting Instructions:

Cast on **52 [56, 30]** stitches

1. Cast on two beanies using a stretchy cast on and either the **Limitless Cast On** or your preferred method, if you are experienced in two-at-a-time knitting
2. Join to work in the round - mark the start of the round
3. Work **30 [34, 38]** rounds in stockinette

To shape crown and decrease:

Round 1 – [K2tog, K2]

Round 2 – Knit

Round 3 – [K2tog, K1]

Round 4 – [K2, K2tog]

Round 5 – [K2tog]

To finish: thread the needle with the long tail.

Turn the beanie inside out. Slip the needle thru the remaining stitches, gather.

Pull tight to ensure there is no hole, and weave in the ends.

Weave in the loose end from your cast on.
